Samim launches its 1st call for projects for more sustainable cities and communities.

For civil society organizations in Mauritania, Morocco, Tunisia and Jordan.

The Samim project is a Mediterranean project to support and strengthen the capacities of civil society organizations (CSOs), financed by the Agence Française de Développement (AFD) and implemented by Lab'ess in partnership with PULSE and 4 Supportting Structures (SS) including Ecodev in Mauritania, Bidaya in Morocco, TCSE in Tunisia and JYIF in Jordan.

Samim launches its 1st call for projects (CFP) for CSOs which will be carried out locally by the 4 SS in the 4 intervention countries for **more sustainable cities and communities**, and more specifically around the following sub-themes:

- Waste management
- Circular economy
- Sustainable mobility
- Responsible consumption
- Eco-urbanism
- Urban agriculture in the broad sense
- Sustainable food
- Sustainable tourism
- Housing and energy transition
- Social and civic innovations

At the end of this call, 20 to 24 innovative initiatives in **Nouakchott**, **Casablanca**, **Tunis and Amman** will benefit from a financial support of €30,000 to €40,000 and a technical assistance with the objective to strengthen the structure of CSOs and support the management of initiatives.

The call starts on 23 January and closes on 20 February 2023 jointly in the 4 partner countries in Mauritania, Morocco, Tunisia and Jordan.

For whom?

This Call for Proposals (CFP) is aimed at young civil society willing to implement projects dealing with the different challenges that cities face in order to be more accessible, livable and resilient to climate change.


















What are the benefits?

- Sensitive to gender and social inclusion dynamics
- Developed in the cities of Nouakchott, Casablanca, Tunis and Amman.
- Planned to ensure implementation of up to 1 year
- Demonstrating an adequate sustainability strategy


